On the third floor come the children's wards. Here toys and everything to make a homelike atmosphere; tables inlaid with picture tiles, and animals of every

Space does not permit of all one would wish to say of the beautiful accommodation provided in the Nurses' Home—on which much time and thought must have been bestowed in arranging such charming and comfortable quarters.

Finally, the Student Nurses Preliminary Training School is visited—a most important department—here the students are indeed fortunate, not only in the advantage of perfectly equipped lecture room and demonstration department, but in the prevailing atmosphere of the spirit of healing. The framed lines that hang on the wall are words of wisdom which we all might take to heart:—

An excellent arrangement in this institution is the placing of the commissariat department high on this third floor, *i.e.*, the large kitchen from which is issued the appetising food.

The 28 private rooms on the top and fourth floor in which the cream and pale green colour scheme of decoration has a soothing effect—added to which the aesthetic furnishing and every necessary comfort, leave nothing to be desired. Here again a patient resting in the pleasant corridor bay, unsolicited, commented on her experience of Moorfields: "the astonishing kindness and wonderful treatment, so ungrudgingly given."
