In Memoriam



THE LATE MRS. BEDFORD FENWICK.

On March 13th, 1947, at 10.30 p.m., the greatest Nurse within living memory laid down the burden of her life.

Mrs. Bedford Fenwick, aged 90 years, née Ethel Gordon Manson, was born at Spynie House, near Elgin, in Morayshire, younger daughter of Dr. David Davidson Manson. Her mother was a Palmer of Thurnscoe Manor, Yorkshire.

Her father died whilst she was in her infancy, and later her mother married again, a Mr. George Storer, of Thoroton Hall, Notts, who was a Member of Parliament. She was educated in a cultured and quiet atmosphere, and at the age of 21 years she sallied forth to train as a nurse.

She became Matron of St. Bartholomew's Hospital at the early age of 24 years, and her
