

(iv) Sister Tutor Certificate of the University of Leeds;
 (v) Certificate of the International Course of Nurse Administrators and Teachers in Schools of Nursing issued by the League of Red Cross Societies or subsequently by the Florence Nightingale International Foundation;

(vi) Sister Tutor Certificate of the South-West Essex Technical College and School of Art;

(vii) Diploma in Nursing of the University of Leeds or the University of London, and in addition must submit evidence of not less than two years' whole-time experience in the teaching of nursing prior to December 31st, 1946;

(viii) Such other teaching certificate or teaching diploma as may be acceptable to the Council, and in addition must submit evidence of experience in the teaching of nursing for at least three years prior to December 31st, 1946; or

(ix) Such experience as the Council may approve, including not less than two years' whole-time experience in the teaching of nursing prior to December 31st, 1939.

40.—A fee not exceeding £3 3s. 0d. shall be payable on the granting of the Council's Certificate. In the event of such Certificate becoming lost or accidentally destroyed the holder may apply to the Council for a fresh Certificate, and the Council may, if they think fit, grant such fresh Certificate upon payment by the applicant of a fee of one guinea; a Certificate so issued shall be marked "Duplicate."

41.—The Council's Certificate shall be sealed with the Seal of the Council.

42.—The granting of the Council's Certificate shall be indicated by means of a distinguishing mark placed against the entry relating to the holder in the General Part of the Register or in the Part of the Register for Male Nurses general trained as the case may be. The Council's Certificate shall be valid only so long as the holder is so registered.

43.—Any Registered Nurse or Registered Male Nurse who holds a Certificate of Registration as a Sister Tutor granted by the General Nursing Council for Scotland shall on making application to the Registrar of the Council and on paying a fee of 10s. 6d. and on production of the Certificate granted by the General Nursing Council for Scotland be granted a Certificate of Registration as a Sister Tutor.

44.—Any person shall be entitled, upon payment of a fee of 10s., to be furnished with a Certificate under the Seal of the Council certifying that on a specified date, or during a specified period, a specified person is or was, or is not or was not, a Registered Sister Tutor as defined by the Rules.

45.—(i) The Council shall prepare and keep a list of institutions which are for the time being approved by the Council for the purposes of Rule 39 (a) (iii).

(ii) The Council shall prepare and keep a list of Universities which are for the time being approved by the Council for the purposes of Rule 39 (a) (iv).

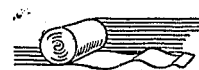

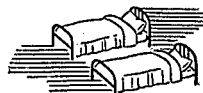
