

### NURSING ECHOES.

The memory of Walsall's Sister Dora was again honoured by the townfolk on January 16th, the anniversary of her birth.

The Mayoress of Walsall placed a garland of flowers on the statue, erected on the Bridge, in memory of Sister Dora's noble and self-sacrificing labours in the cause of the sick and suffering from 1865-1878.

Members of the Nursing Profession and others also placed floral tributes on the statue, and a wreath of laurels and some flowers were placed on her grave in Queen Street Cemetery.

The Nursing Profession are deeply gratified for the continued remembrance of a colleague whose presence among most of the people of Walsall is but a tradition.

In Saint Wilfrid's Church, Haywards Heath, Sussex, one finds three most remarkable stained glass windows, placed there in memory of two brothers who gave their lives in the First World War, two of which we have pleasure in presenting herewith. The picture on the left shows a young wounded officer being held up by a soldier, but he is looking over his shoulder to the centre window—portraying a figure of Christ. In the third window, his brother is seen dying in a ward with a nurse standing by his side, but his eyes are also looking towards the central figure of Christ, with arms outstretched, showing wounds in hands.
