

against her, there was apparently no clear evidence as to where the drugs had gone.

It was agreed that her name be removed from the Register of Nurses, but there seemed to be no anxiety shown as to how she should be cared for in the future. The Chairman notified her that she would be informed at a later date how to apply for re-instatement.

If Miss Miller took the drugs herself, there appeared to be no evidence as to the reason for her first being tempted to do so.

We should have preferred to see her accompanied by some responsible sympathetic person when giving her evidence.

The name of Miss Mary Margaret Leahy, R.F.N. 14613 was removed from the Register of Nurses.

The case of Miss Emily Beatrice Smalldon; S.R.N. 79643 was dismissed.

The case of Miss Mary Wilde, S.R.N. 137661 (deferred from Council, 29th November, 1946) was dismissed.

The Council then went *in camera* to discuss the re-institution of the Test Examination and the proposed Revised Syllabuses of Subjects for examination.

There was also a Committee of Council to consider the report of the Working Party on the Recruitment and Training of Nurses.
