Final: Wednesday, February 7th, 1951.

February 13th-16th, 1951.
February 20th-23rd, 1951.

* FIRST day for applying for Entry Forms, Tuesday, November 7th, 1950.

LAST day for applying for Entry Forms, Tuesday, November 21st, 1950.

These dates do not apply to candidates who were present at the October, 1950, Examinations (see footnote).

LAST day for sending in completed Entry Forms, Tuesday, November 28th, 1950.

Applications for forms should be addressed to the Registrar, The General Nursing Council for England and Wales, 23, Portland Place, London, W.1. Applications for forms should not be made by telephone, and forms must not be called for unless previous notification is given of the number required. Letters of application for forms should not contain reference to other subjects, as this may cause delay in dealing with the application.

Candidates for the Preliminary Examination must complete the prescribed period of training by the last day of February. Candidates for the Final Examination must have attained the required age and have completed the prescribed period of training by the last day of February.

BIRTH CERTIFICATES. Except in the case of candidates who commenced training on or after June 1st, 1947, and whose Birth Certificates have already been submitted with their applications for admission to the Index of Student Nurses, each first entry for the Preliminary Examination must be accompanied by a Birth Certificate. (For special cases where a birth has not been registered please refer to regulations.)

In no circumstances may a candidate change her Centre after December 27th, 1950.

RESULTS. The results of the examination will be published before the end of March, 1951.

*SPECIAL NOTICE: The October, 1950, Examination results will be posted on November 24th. Candidates who were present at and completed that Examination should apply for February forms not earlier than November 25th and not later than November 29th. These forms must be returned by December 4th, 1950. In no circumstances must any candidate submit more than one entry form and one fee.

THE GENERAL NURSING COUNCIL FOR ENGLAND AND WALES invites applications for the following posts:—

(a) INSPECTOR OF TRAINING SCHOOLS FOR STUDENT NURSES AND PUPIL ASSISTANT NURSES.

Applicants must be State Registered Nurses with experience in hospital administration and in the training of nurses. The appointment in the first instance will be on a temporary basis at a commencing salary of £550 per annum, plus travelling and subsistence allowances. Payment of employers' contributions by the Council in the case of an applicant already participating in a Superannuation Scheme for Nurses will be considered. Inspectors are required to wear State Registered Uniform when on official duty; a uniform allowance of £50 for the first year and £25 a year subsequently is made.

(b) ASSISTANT EXAMINATIONS OFFICER.

Salary scale £450 by £20 to £550 per annum. Applicants must have had experience in the organisation of examinations on a large scale, be able to deal with correspondence and be experienced in supervising staff.

(c) ASSISTANT ACCOUNTANT.

Salary scale £450 by £20 to £550 per annum. Applicants must have passed the examinations of one of the recognised bodies of Accountants, have had experience in accountancy, be fully conversant with office routine and be experienced in supervising staff.

(d) PRINCIPAL CLERK.

Salary scale £325 by £15 to £415 per annum. Applicants must be State Registered Nurses, fully conversant with office routine and able to undertake responsible secretarial duties.

The Federated Superannuation Scheme for Nurses and Hospital Officers is in force in respect of posts (b), (c) and (d).
